# EARL STONHAM TRUST & THE BOWLS CLUB



*Sadly, the Bowls Club has informed the Trust it will not be renewing the ground lease this Autumn.*

The area has been occupied by the Bowls Club for over sixty years and marks the end of an era in the Village. The Trust has been considering the best alternative use for the site.

The prefabricated Clubhouse is constructed from low grade asbestos sheeting and facilities are in need of renovation to bring up to modern standards. The Trust does not have the funds to do this and neither does the Bowls Club have resources to remove all buildings from the site and reinstate ground as required by the terms of the lease. The Bowling Green is situated on a large mound which further restricts use of the site such as extension of the car park.

This corner forms part of the Recreation Ground endowed to the Village in 1933 and managed by Earl Stonham Trust, a Charitable Trust which is bound by its Constitution and Charity Commission rules to maximise the best use of an asset to maintain an income for the Trust. The Village Hall and car park are separate entities.

*The area cannot be left to deteriorate and as Trustees have not found a viable long term alternative use for the site, have reluctantly concluded to apply for outline planning permission to develop the area for housing, if possible.*

*This could ultimately mean disposal of part of a Village asset although the main Recreation Ground would remain as it is. From my perspective I would like to thank the other current members - mostly from Stowmarket - as without their support and enthusiasm our club would have foundered a long time ago, and also thanks must go to our landlords - Earl Stonham Trustees who have been very patient and supportive during the last two years, when we struggled to make ends meet.

## **County Councillor's Report**



### **Suffolk's Health and Wellbeing Board has committed to tackling poor mental health in Suffolk**

In June 2019, Suffolk's Health and Wellbeing Board demonstrated their commitment to tackling poor mental health by signing up to the Prevention Concordat for Better Mental Health. Working closely with Public Health England, Suffolk's Health and Wellbeing Board is making significant steps towards promoting good mental health and preventing mental health problems. One in six adults experiences at least one diagnosable mental health problem in their lifetime. This is influenced by the environment in which we are born, grow, live and work - meaning many of these problems can be prevented.

Having good mental health is important because it can help us to be more resilient, feel good and function well, have more positive relationships with those around us, and deal with difficult times now and in the future. The Prevention Concordat marks the first-time agencies across the community and care sectors have come together to make prevention a priority for mental health. So far, 92 organisations representing all sectors have signed up and committed to action. The commitment from Suffolk's Health and Wellbeing Board includes work to improve people's mental health, including preventing suicide, social prescribing initiatives and a pilot for a new online resource supporting young people aged 16-24.

### **Foster carers for Suffolk children**

As a local authority, Suffolk County Council is responsible for more than 800 children in care in Suffolk. The Suffolk Fostering & Adoption service is part of Suffolk County Council, and their goal is to secure families for Suffolk children, either on a short-term or permanent basis. The service has been rated Outstanding by Ofsted. Fostering is a big commitment, but it is an incredibly rewarding journey. Foster carers can make a real difference to a child's life, providing them with the nurturing home life they need to give them every chance of a happy childhood and to succeed in life. Suffolk Fostering & Adoption

aren't looking for perfect families. They need people with a passion and an ability to provide children in their care with love, patience and a sense of belonging.

When you foster for Suffolk you:

- Give back to your community and offer help and support to the most vulnerable children in Suffolk.

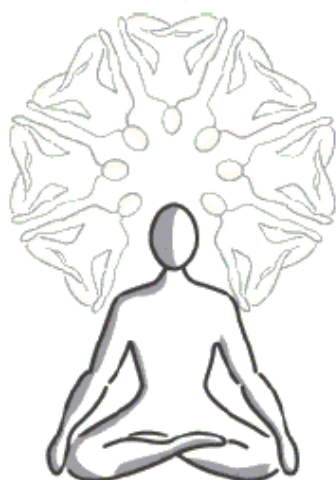

## DR DAN POULTER MP

Member of Parliament for Central Suffolk and North Ipswich

Being at home in Suffolk over the summer months makes me appreciate all that is good about our county, but due to its rural nature, we can often take for granted that work that goes on here to keep us safe in our communities.

But this is not to say that crime does not feature here in Suffolk – I would like to commend the outstanding work going on around the clock with our dedicated team of Police Officers, PCSOs and those working tirelessly behind the scenes to combat the scourge of crime and indeed, online crime. Along with my fellow Suffolk MPs, I meet regularly with our Police and Crime Commissioner to hear about advances in the service, the achievements of Suffolk Constabulary and also to find out what more we, as Suffolk MPs, can do to help support our fantastic Constabulary.

Perhaps number one on our Police and Crime Commissioner's request list is more and fairer funding for Suffolk's Police. That's why I am delighted to welcome our new Prime Minister – Boris Johnson's pledge to invest in recruiting 20,000 new police officers across the country. People want to see more officers in their neighbourhoods, protecting the public and cutting crime.

Suffolk remains a wonderful county in which to live and do business, and a safe place to visit, but we do need to work together to tackle crime effectively. There are a great many dedicated people working tirelessly in our public services and in our communities to help discourage our young people from a life of violence and crime. But they can't do this alone. Together, our Police, Councils and communities in Suffolk share a collective responsibility, along with Government, to stop violent crime - that's why I am delighted with the Government's announcement to urgently boost policing numbers to help us to tackle the scourge of knife crime head on, as well as other criminal activity.

But let's be clear - crime of any nature is a blight on our communities, intimidating those who live and work in the area, and affecting quality of life. Our Prime Minister has been clear the he fully supports the Police's use of "Stop and Search" to tackle and disrupt those carrying knives and I am therefore especially pleased that as part of its ongoing work to tackle serious violence, the Government will also urgently review a pilot, which makes it simpler for officers to use stop and search powers, with a view to rolling this out across all Constabularies at the earliest opportunity.

You may have heard of the 'Fit Villages' initiative which is operated by the local council to improve general fitness. A survey to assess demand in our village was sent out with the last Recorder and this identified that a light exercise class, suitable for both able-bodied and those with limited mobility would be worth pursuing. 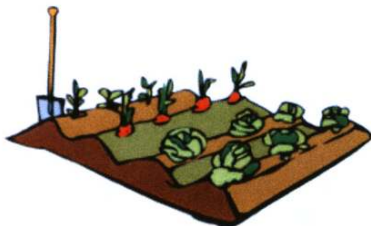
