Information on Grass Cutting around the Parish

Suffolk County Council Highways are responsible for cutting the verges (twice a year) within the parish and each year provide a grass cutting programme which can be found at https://www.suffolk.gov.uk/roads-and-transport/roads-pavements-and-verges/trees-grass-and-weeds/grass-cutting/

Anyone can access this information and report any problems using the Highways Report it tool, which can also be accessed via the above link.

The Parish Council has been informed that the first 1.2 metres of all roadside verges will be cut from now on instead of the verge as a whole.

Pavements/Pathways, such as the one from Wicks Lane to Blacksmiths Lane comes under **Weed Control** and will be cut **once per year** by Suffolk Highways.

<u>Please Note</u>: Footpaths and public rights of way are different to pavements/pathways.

The Village Green is the responsibility of the Parish Council who has a contract with Vertas Group Ltd, who cut the grass regularly throughout the Summer. If there are any problems with the Village Green, please contact the Parish Clerk.

Welcome to another edition of the Recorder which is published in both print and online versions.

As I write this, many of the restrictions were lifted 2 weeks ago and we are all having to get used to living with Covid - just to think 18 months ago we had never heard of it or knew how it would come to dominate our lives for the next 18 months. In the village,

activities are beginning to restart - the first Coffee and Cake Friday has taken place, some activities and classes at the Village Hall have restarted, Church services have resumed and the **Picnic on the Green** is due to take place on **Sunday 5 September**. As we move into the Autumn other activities will begin - information about forthcoming activities and events can be found on the **What's On Page** on the Village website.

Despite all the uncertainties arising from Covid the seasons continue their steady march through the year - the first harvests have begun and fields have been ploughed ready for next year's crops but much still remains to be harvested. It's hard to think that I am writing this for the Autumn edition of the Recorder and we are still in the height of Summer, although the weather has been somewhat changeable of late. We are indeed fortunate to live in a village with beautiful surroundings.

With that in mind all the recent work that took place over the last few months didn't happen without a significant input from local volunteers - there are always projects that need committed support from people who live in and around the village - if you would like to get involved please email recorder@btinternet.com

As well as more general involvement, the Parish Council is trying to assess whether there is sufficient interest locally to establish a Community Speed

Watch Team as another means of addressing the issue of speeding through the village. As part of the Community Speed Watch programme, trained volunteers verify and record the registration number of vehicles seen to breaking the speed limit. To be able to proceed we would need a minimum of 6 volunteers with someone prepared to act as coordinator. If you would like to be involved, please email parishclerk@earlstonham.org.uk to register your interest so that we can set up a meeting to take this further.

Following the Annual Parish Council meetings, Councillor Di Brenig-Jones decided to step down and we would like to thank her for her significant contribution to the Parish Council during her very long tenure both as Parish Councillor and Chair of the Council and wish her all the very best for the future. This means that we currently have 2 vacancies for Parish Councillors to be co-opted on to the Council - please look out for the advert in this edition of the Recorder.

Sadly, in June we had an incident at the Village Hall which involved someone interfering with the Defibrillator, resulting in it falling on to the floor and being left there for someone else to pick up. Fortunately no damage was done given its importance as a life saving device. While some devices do require a key code to access the Defibrillator, we were advised that it would better for our device to be freely & quickly accessible in the event of an emergency.

Finally, it would be remiss of me not to mark the recent passing of Tony Porch and Brian Sayers. Originally a Londoner, Tony fell in love with Suffolk and a Suffolk girl and would have been known and well-regarded by many residents of the village and surrounding area who knew him as an individual as well as a local farmer and builder. Although Brian Sayers and his late wife, Bridget, lived in Jack's Green he had a close association with the Village and in fact painted the village sign on the Village Green and re-painted it when it was most recently restored.

The next meetings of the Parish Council are planned for **6 September**, **1 November and 3 January**. These will be held at the Village Hall and will start at 7.30pm.



Vacancies for 2 Parish Councillors (to be co-opted)

Earl Stonham Parish Council is a local authority that makes decisions on behalf of the people who live in the parish. It is the level of local government closest to the community, with Mid-Suffolk District Council and Suffolk County Council above it in the hierarchy.

On their own, parish councils have limited powers to make decisions, but they do have the ability to negotiate with, and the power to influence other organisations that do make the final decisions. Probably the most common topics that parish councils get involved with are planning matters (we are statutory consultees), crime prevention, roads and highways.

Earl Stonham Parish Council currently has 7 Councillors, with 2 vacancies following the resignations of Colin Woods and Di Brenig-Jones earlier this year. We are now seeking expressions of interest from people who are over 18 years of age who live or work in Earl Stonham.

If you would like to find out more about the role of a Parish Councillor you could come along to our next meeting at the Village Hall on Monday 6 September at 7.30pm or speak to the Parish Clerk or any of the 7 current Parish Councillors – contact details can be found on the Parish Council pages on the Earl Stonham website.



The Trust owns 1 Guildhall Cottage and is responsible for maintenance. Tony, wearing his qualified electrician's hat, kindly offered to inspect & upgrade the cottage electrical system for which he was thanked. It was also noted that repair & redecorating of the porch needs to be arranged, weather permitting.

The ownership of the Recreation Ground involves the upkeep of the Junior Playpark, swings, slide and table tennis table. The Multicourt is managed by the Parish Council.

Although the annual professional inspection of the play equipment deems it safe, rust was noted by volunteers undertaking the weekly inspections. Bad weather prevented action earlier in the year and it is regretted the junior playpark had to be closed in the summer holidays for painting to be arranged. If anyone has any concerns regarding the equipment at any time, please contact a trustee.

This opportunity is also taken to thank Jonathan Rice for cutting the perimeter hedge which like most plants this year had considerable growth!

In the days when only the wealthy could afford a motor car, the village shop


provided most day-to-day requirements for local people. As well as groceries, many of them provided hardware, clothing, paraffin and other essentials.
