## EARL STONHAM PARISH COUNCIL NEWS



Welcome to the Winter edition of the Recorder. The heat and warmth of the summer and autumn now seem a distant memory – our pond is being replenished following the period of recent wet weather – for the first time since we've lived here, it dried out completely.

It's almost Panto Season – this year's production by Stonham Theatre Guild is Dick Whittington with performances taking place on **Friday 2<sup>nd</sup> December at 7.00pm, Saturday 3<sup>rd</sup> December at 2.00pm and at 6.30pm** – book early to guarantee a seat either by email to the box office ([boxofficestg@gmail.com](mailto:boxofficestg@gmail.com)) or by telephoning 01449 711461.

Continuing the Christmas theme, there is an opportunity to take part in a workshop on Advent Wreath Making with Red Lavender Floristry on **Friday 9<sup>th</sup> December**. Full details can be found in the What's On page of the village website and in this issue of the Recorder.

Carols on the Green will be held again this year on **Monday 19<sup>th</sup> December from 6.30pm**.

I am sure that you will all have seen the coverage of the challenging economic conditions and the high cost of energy. The Village Hall and Parish Council are working together to make the village hall available for one day a week as a 'Warm Space' with refreshments and friendly faces around. We will be one of several local venues offering this support and Mid-Suffolk are making funding available to support this. 18 local people have come forward to offer their support to the scheme and we will be publishing more details in the near future.

The Community Speed Watch Team continues to operate, with 2 additional volunteers joining the team, bringing the total to 14 volunteers. Despite the numbers they still have difficulty in arranging sessions as a minimum of 3 people are needed for each speed watch session. As always more volunteers

would be welcomed. As the team can only operate during daylight hours, the winter months will curtail the times the team can operate.

During October, 3 sessions took place with a total of 58 vehicles recorded as speeding and reported through to the Police of which

- 41 were going between 34 and 39 MPH
- 16 were going between 40 and 49 MPH
- And 1 more than 50 MPH

In the last edition of the Recorder, I mentioned that the Parish Council had made a donation to the Village Hall to enable a tribute to be placed in the Jubilee Garden to recognise all the volunteer effort that went into, not only the events of the Jubilee weekend, but the creation of the Jubilee Garden. I am pleased to say that a metal tree sculpture has been purchased and will shortly be installed.

#### Updates from the Parish Council

- A small working group continues to explore options for the 7 streetlights for which we are responsible. 2 lights have been replaced as the lanterns are now end of life. We have recently received an update from Suffolk County Council informing us that the energy costs for the first 5 months of the year have increased by 102% over last year – this makes replacing the remaining lights with LED even more important.
- Anglian Water postponed the second phase of works to replace the sewer on the A1120 pending the completion of the A14 roadworks which were due to take place from August to October but were postponed. We don't yet have a date for these works.
- Following the distribution of the speed stickers and the work of Community Speed Watch, we are exploring whether it is possible to install Village Gateway Signs to make the 30mph speed limit even more obvious. With Councillor Matthew Hicks' support we are awaiting a Traffic Survey to measure the number, type and speed of vehicles passing through the village over the course of a week.
- Work is in hand to refurbish the Village Sign, and we will be discussing needed repairs to the War Memorial at our November meeting.

- Over 50 people attended the public meeting held at the beginning of June to discuss the National Grid proposals to reinforce the high-voltage electricity network from Norwich Main substation via Bramford substation to Tilbury substation in Essex. We are awaiting further information but continue to monitor developments. The Essex, Suffolk and Norfolk Pylon Group continue to be active in lobbying MPs and the Government. The next meetings of the Parish Council will take place on **9 January and 6 March 2023** and will be held at the Village Hall in the Club Room and will start at 7.30pm. Our meetings are open to the public and all are welcome to attend.

Finally, this just leaves me to wish everyone a very Happy Christmas and a healthy 2023.

## ELECTRIC VEHICLE CHARGING STATION

As part of the 'Greenest County' scheme by Suffolk County, grants were made available for the installation of electric vehicle chargers. Earl Stonham applied for one of these and a charger has now been installed at the Village Hall.

This is located at the far corner of the car park adjacent to the old Bowls Club entrance and is a 2 socket, 7kw charger and costs **45p per kw** with any profit going to the village hall. It is available for anyone to use and can be used with a normal contactless credit/debit card or via a smartphone app.

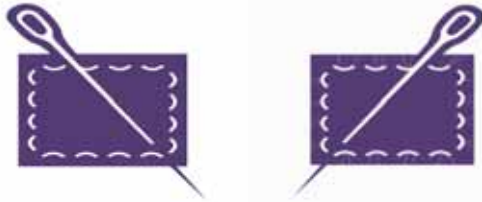

After such a dry summer and wet autumn, it has been quite surprising to see how well the Jubilee Garden has developed – I think it has the greenest grass in the village! It has been further improved this week with the addition of a metal tree sculpture which has been purchased with money supplied by the Parish Council as a thank you to all those that helped with the organisation of the Jubilee celebrations. We have also had confirmed that we have been successful in our application for assistance from the Mid-Suffolk Biodiversity fund and they will be supplying hornbeam hedging for the back of the jubilee garden as well as some fruit trees and wildflower seed for the bowls green.



Quiz nights continue to be well attended. You may not be aware but the £3 ‘participation fee’ is passed directly to a chosen charity. With the current economic situation we have decided that we will donate the fees for this year to the Stowmarket Food Bank. The hall doesn’t charge for hosting the quiz and the only revenue the hall receives from the quiz, is from people using the bar.

In recent months, there has been a significant increase in people bringing their own drinks to quiz and pub nights which definitely does not help the hall finances! If there are particular drinks that you would like the bar to stock, then please let us know – one area we will be stocking in future is alcohol free beer and cider. The bar at the hall is considerably cheaper than a pub so please do use it when attending hall events.

Preparation for this year’s Stonham Theatre Guild pantomime is now well underway. This year it is Dick Whittington and among the

normal pantomime fare there is a surprise in store about his cat Tommy! Please do come along and support the pantomime which brings together a huge range of local people, both young and old to hone their acting skills as well as all the other jobs needed to stage the production. Details of how to book tickets can be found on the poster in this edition of the Recorder.

Library lunches are going to resume at the hall from November with the first one on **Friday 25 November** and the following one on **Friday 20 January**. For those that have not attended these before, they are set to coincide with the visit of the mobile library to the hall and village organisations take turns at running them. You don't need to use the Library to attend – just come along to the lunch if you like! These will be returning to a more simple format than before – there will be hot drinks and lunch of a soup and a roll and cake.

We are also putting in place arrangements to open the hall as a 'warm space' once per week – probably on a Wednesday. We will start these as soon as the weather gets colder. Initially, there will be hot drinks and games etc provided but we hope the attendees can decide what other things they would like to take part in....

Picnic on the Green took place again in September and we were fortunate to have entertainment provided by Tony Haley and John Perkins. We were very lucky with the weather and it was a very pleasant way of spending a sunny September afternoon.

The next Supper Evening will be an evening of festive fare on **10 December**. See the advert elsewhere for details of how to reserve your space. The bar will be open if you would just like to come along for a drink and chat.

Finally, I would like to pass on some thank you's to some of the people who quietly help at the hall and get little recognition. Helen Brownsell looks after the flower tubs by the front door – I noticed today that these have been refreshed for autumn and really make the entrance look welcoming. (with help from Barbara 😊), Steve Jowett who spent a day digging the trench with his mini-digger to lay on the services to the Bowls Club buildings and Sue Beckett who has been helping cut the Bowls Club grass which was really appreciated after I broke my arm!. None of these are committee members – just all generously giving their time to keep the hall looking so good.

It just leaves me to wish everyone a Merry Christmas and Happy New Year from the Village Hall Committee.

This proposal maintains the area for use of residents which the Trustees favour, solves existing parking problems and makes use of the buildings. A suitable lease is being arranged.

## FROM YOUR LOCAL RECORDER

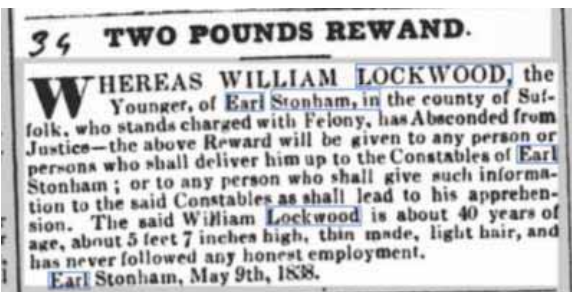
We often hear of miscreants being transported to Australia for apparently minor crimes and in July 1838 we have an Ipswich Journal report of William and Charles Lockwood, both of Earl Stonham, being transported for 14 and 10 years

*William Lockwood*, (40), indicted for having stolen eleven live hens, the property of Wm. Hart, of Stowupland, was found guilty. An *alibi* was attempted to be set up by Mr. O'Malley, the counsel for the prisoner, who called the daughter of his client for that purpose, but he failed in proving it.—The prisoner was then arraigned on another indictment, which charged him with stealing 7 hens, the property of Samuel Ford, on the 27th of March last. Guilty. 14 years' transportation.

*Charles Lockwood*, (24), was indicted for having entered the dwelling-house of James Hunt, of Earl Stonham, and stolen therefrom fourteen live hens, deposited in Mr. Hunt's hands, as constable, for safe custody. Guilty. Transported for Ten Years.

respectively. They had been found guilty of separate offences of the theft of live hens. William had stolen seven hens from Mr Ford, of Stowupland and Charles had taken fourteen birds from Mr Hunt, the Constable, who was holding them for safe custody. (Were some of these the same hens?)

This seems on the face of it to have been a disproportionate punishment for the offences committed, but there's probably more to the story than appears at first sight. Two months earlier, William had escaped from justice and a reward of forty shillings



was offered for his apprehension. He is described as being aged about 40 and never having followed any honest employment. One can infer that he was a 'bad lot' with a history of previous

offending and the justices had finally lost patience with him.

My thanks to Simon Hailes of Stonham Parva, who has discovered this story in the course of his research into his Lockwood forebears.
